

Guidelines for Cognate in Music Technology

The cognate in music technology is intended for DMA or PhD students in other musical disciplines who seek a deeper and more comprehensive understanding of the intersections between technology and contemporary musical practices. This cognate is particularly appropriate for students interested in 1) electroacoustic composition and performance, 2) computer programming for creative audio, and/or 3) audio recording, mixing, and engineering.

Required coursework for the music technology cognate consists of at least 8 credit hours selected from the following courses:

Students wishing to pursue this cognate should contact Dr. Eli Fieldsteel (cognate advisor) to discuss a specific program of study.

*Topics in MUS 404 vary. Cognate credit is granted in consultation with the cognate advisor only when the topic is directly related to music technology.

†Topics vary by semester, but are usually technology-related. This course may be repeated for additional cognate credit with different topics, pending consultation with the cognate advisor.

**Only one from these three THEA courses will count towards the cognate in music technology. Students wishing to take more than one of these courses should consider designing their own unique cognate plan to suit their interests.
