



# Hunger-Free Summer Hub Project Evaluation

**The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a program funded by the United States Department of Agriculture. The program provides free meals to children 18 years and younger in low-income areas.**

While over 30 million children participate in the National School Lunch and National School Breakfast Program during the school year, participation in summer feeding programs remains stubbornly low. Feeding America and its member food banks have focused their efforts on summer feeding over the past several years. The Hunger-Free Summer Hub (HFSH) initiative was recently funded through the generous support of ConAgra Food Foundation with the goal of determining how food banks can partner with organizations in their community to increase access to and participation in SFSP. Feeding America has selected three foodbanks to participate in this initiative, and the Family Resiliency Center will be conducting evaluations of the HFSH initiative to identify how they can best fight child hunger over the summer in their communities.
