CITY YEAR

The recent outbreak of COVID-19 means that millions of students across the country are losing valuable class time. Now, more than ever, students across the country will need support from someone like you to ensure they are on track towards gradation. City Year is an educational non-profit organization that is hiring over 3,000 young adults, between the ages of 18 and 25 to work full-time across our 29 sites, nationally. Starting in August, you would be hired as an AmeriCorps member to serve as a Student Success Coach, providing individualized support to 3rd-9th graders. City Year partners with schools to identify students who are at risk of not graduating on time with their peers, and provides them with extra academic, emotional, and social support and skills that the students need to be college and career ready.

During this gap year of service, City Year AmeriCorps members receive a living stipend, health benefits, transportation benefits, professional development, student loan forbearance, an education award of \$6,000, and access to a variety of scholarships through their University Partnerships program.
