

UI HEALTH ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE KEY DEFINITIONS - 9/27/2021		
<b>High-Risk Exposure</b>	Someone in the employee's household has COVID-19 or is being tested for COVID-19.	
<b>Medium-Risk Exposure</b>	An employee was present for aerosol generating procedures for a patient positive for COVID-19, with surgical mask and without N95 or PAPR and eye protection, for any duration of time.	
	An employee was unmasked, less than 6ft distance for more than 15 minutes, with a person positive for COVID-19.	
<b>Low-Risk Exposure</b>	An employee was wearing a surgical mask and within 6 feet, for more than 15 minutes cumulatively (in 24 hours) during an encounter with a positive person and was not present for aerosol generating procedures.	
<b>Quarantine</b>	Quarantine separates and restricts the movement of people who were exposed to a contagious disease such as COVID-19. It is used to help reduce the potential risk of transmission of contagious disease. Quarantine is different than isolation.	
<b>Isolation</b>	Separates sick people with a contagious disease from people who are not sick.	
<b>Fully Vaccinated</b>	An employee is considered fully vaccinated against COVID-19 ≥2 weeks after receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna) or ≥2 weeks after receipt of the single dose of the Janssen vaccine.
